Schuff Steel has helped shape the Arizona sports scene and redefine the skylines of cities from Miami to Los Angeles.

The nation's largest structural steel fabricator and erector played a key role in the construction of the home stadiums of the Arizona Cardinals and the Arizona Diamondbacks. Company co-founder David A. Schuff was recognized with the Engineering News-Record "Award of Excellence" for his work on the retractable roof at University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale.

The company is also part of the team building the Wilshire Grand Center in downtown Los Angeles, a 73-story tower that will soar 1,100 feet when completed in 2017.

And then there is the new Apple headquarters in Cupertino, Calif. – an iconic design known as "The Spaceship."

Schuff Steel was founded in Arizona in 1976 and now has 10 fabrication plants located in California, Arizona, Texas, Kansas, Georgia and Florida.

Schuff Steel is committed to community. The pillars of the Arizona World War II Memorial in downtown Phoenix were designed, fabricated and erected by Schuff Steel and members of Ironworkers Local 75.

Schuff Steel is a strong partner of the locals that comprise the District Council of Ironworkers of California and Vicinity. The company even donated a W12 x 120 steel column for use as a climbing column at the Ironworkers Local 75 Field Ironworkers Apprenticeship & Training Program. The company also donated a W36 steel I beam for the new apprentice facility's lobby.
